

Why Good (Democratic) Governance?



- Good Governance creates the basis for de-bureaucratized management, forming a socially responsible public authority accountable to citizens.
- In 2023 Council of Europe adopted Recommendation of Committee of Ministers to member States on the principles of good democratic governance

European Label of Governance Excellence (ELoGE) Benchmark process in Lithuania


The level of municipalities verification of the 12 principles of good governance includes:

- self-assessment of the services where municipalities identified their level of maturity for each Principle (50% of total final score);
- questionnaire addressed to citizens (30% of total final score);
- questionnaire addressed to employees and members of councillors (20% of total final score).

39 municipalities (from 60) took part in evaluation, 31 finished the whole self-assessment process, 29 municipalities received the certificates

How this toll can help to improve governance?



- ✓ The EloGE tools are not intended to "compare who is better" but
 to self-evaluate and improve performance.
- During evaluation:
 - employees' knowledge of the Good Governance quality standards was improved;
 - ✓ best practices between municipalities at meetings were shared;
 - ✓ self-assessment and its results comparison with citizens, employees and council members opinion made it possible to look at municipality activities from the outside, understanding the role of each department or even staff member in wellbeing of the municipality;
 - ✓ it's promotes the awareness of municipalities and shows areas that should be improved and provides guidelines for this.
